Sports Premium Report 2016 – 17

Grestone Academy received £10,560 Sports Premium funding for the year 2016 – 17.

This money was allocated to the development of PE and Sport throughout the academy by:

Funding an external consultant who will:

- Support staff in developing effective practice across the PE curriculum
- Support the academy in developing competitive sporting opportunities for pupils through the School Games initiative, leading to the academy achieving the School Games Mark –Bronze.

The academy will also fund an apprentice to support the delivery of PE across the academy that will:

- Support the development of competitive sporting opportunities
- Support the development of active lunchtimes
- Support the development of extra-curricular sporting opportunities

The expected outcomes of these initiatives are:

- To improve the quality of PE across the school
- Provide increased opportunities for pupils to experience a variety of sports enabling them to develop long term active lifestyles
- Provide opportunities to identify talented pupils and signpost them to further activities
